ERASMUS+ AND THE ESF IN THE FUTURE EU BUDGET

What does it mean for you?

The Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) Post-2020 will set the budgets for all EU programmes, including Erasmus+ and the ESF - key financial tools for non-formal adult education in EU countries. Negotiations on the new MFF have already started among the Member States. Key decisions will be taken in the upcoming weeks and

If you want to make sure that EU funding for non-formal adult education will be sustained and increased in the next funding period of the European Union, now is your time to act!

The process leading up to the MFF Post-2020











15 February 2018

EU Education Ministers will discuss the future Erasmus+ programme at the Education, Youth, Culture and Sports Council.

15 and 16 February 2018

The Bulgarian EU Presidency will bring together stakeholders of the European Social Fund to discuss priorities and expectations of the post-2020 period.

EU Finance Ministers will discuss the MFF Post-2020 at the Economic and Financial Affairs Council.

May 2018

The European Commission will publish a first proposal for the MFF Post-2020 with the main narrative and key figures.

What will happen after that?



In the second quarter of 2018, the European Commission will publish a package comprising a comprehensive proposal for the MFF Post-2020. This will be followed by proposals for the next generation of programmes and new own resource

Our key messages



Erasmus+ and the ESF need better funding to enable innovation and development of new programmes, and to increase the accessibility of educational offers for more learners, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds.



Currently, only around 5 percent of the total Erasmus+ budget are allocated to non-formal adult education. In order to increase participation rates in adult education in the EU, a bigger share of the budget for adult education is needed.



Many adult education organisations and providers operate on a very small budget and staff, some of them even on a voluntary basis. Easier application and reporting procedures in Erasmus+ and the ESF would enable more of them to access funding.
