# Introducing Life Skills for All model in Finland

- Study Centre Sivis and The Finnish Lifelong Learning Foundation KVS: Life Skills for All model
- The model is based on Citizens' Curriculum, an approach developed by Learning and Work Institute, and was tested and localized in Finland.

"Our vision is of a society in which learning plays its full role in personal growth and emancipation, prosperity, solidarity and local and global responsibility. " Tom Schuller & David Watson, Learning Through Life. 2009







### Life Skills for All model

- The Life Skills for All -model is an approach to learning and educating basic skills (literacy, numeracy, digital skills) that ties them in the context of adults' everyday lives, personal finances, health and active citizenship.







# A holistic approach

- As an essential part of this model is learner participation in curriculum design and responding to learners' real learning needs.
- The model has three main principles:
  - Learner engagement: learners participate in curricum design, set goals and plan contents
  - local context for learning: learning takes place in the physical and social contexts of the learner, utilising networks as well as peer learning
  - an interlinked combination of basic skills: literacy, numeracy and digital skills are learned through solving everyday challenges.







## Steps toward the Finnish model

- Benchmarking Citizens' Curriculum in Rochdale, Manchester & Leicester 1/2019
- 2. Piloting the model in 6 pilot trainings: Savonlinna, Espoo and Turku Spring and Autumn 2019
- 3. Service design 10/2019
- 4. Website opens 12/2019 4/2020
- 5. Dissemination seminar 25.3.2020







## Meeting the needs of learners

- Designing a course that is appealing and based on real learning needs
- Requires understanding the target group
- At the same time the theme should be open enough for learner participation
- Also the practical side: how much flexibility/support the group needs, schedules -> how can we enable participation
- Everybody has skills and knowledge, everybody is equal in the learning process
- Key elements: trust







### Savonlinna: inclusion and active citizenship

-Group 1: migrants

In cooperation with a vocational school at the end of the school year – participants are heading to a new phase

-Group 2: youngsters

In cooperation with youth housing

Themes: getting to know the surroundings, life planning, nature









# Espoo: wellbeing and support for entrepreneurs

# General aims: improving financial & health skills

Themes: taking care of oneself and recognizing learning needs

Entrepreneurs don't have the same support services than workers

Peer support played a major role Feedback









### Feedback from learners

- "I learned several interesting and useful things about nature, cooking, ancient beliefs"
- "I liked it that we actually did stuff, there was no sitting around"
- "I wouldn't have done these thing on my own"
- "As an entrepreneur I am alone, I don't have colleagues as my mirror nor medical services now I am taking full advantage of this support"
- "I learned cooperation and social skills"

# Second round, what happened after?

- Employment advisory
- Supporting finding own apartment
