BREXIT AND ERASMUS+ PROJECTS

The Withdrawal Agreement foresees that the UK will continue to participate in the current 2014-2020 EU programmes, including Erasmus+, as if the UK was an EU Member State until the closure of the programmes. This means that UK beneficiaries can continue to take part in grants awarded under the current MFF until their end date, even if it is after 2020.

All existing Erasmus+ projects that have a contract to deliver funded activities are advised to continue to do so. Organisations intending to submit applications for centralised (administered by the European Commission) and de-centralised (administered by the National Agency) funding should also continue to apply as planned, in line with the published funding deadlines.

The possible participation of the UK in future programmes after 2020 will depend on the outcome of the overall negotiations on the future relationship between the two parties.

Will adult education staff in Britain still be eligible for KA1 mobility after Brexit? Will European Union member states be able to send staff to training offers in Britain using KA1 funding after Brexit?

At present, while the UK is no longer a member state it is still a 'programme country' under Erasmus+ and as such staff can participate in training activities in Britain, and British staff can apply for KA1 funding.

This should continue for the Brexit transition period, but after this will depend on ongoing negotiations between the EU and Britain.
