INNOVATION IN ADULT LEARNING IN THE REGION OF BADEN-WÜRTTEMBERG: STUDY VISIT

Innovative ALE initiatives in Baden-Württemberg (BW) will be investigated, mainly focusing on digital learning in ALE including hard- and software solutions, methodological approaches, digital content of learning offers for different target groups (low-skilled adults, parents, older learners etc.) and business models for digital and hybrid learning. As a second aspect, career guidance – both digitalised guidance and guidance with view to future skills – will be at the focus of the event.

The peer learning activity will consist of a mixture of on-site visits at schools and education partners' premises and discussion forums with relevant stakeholders.

# CREATING A COLLABORATIVE LIFELONG LEARNING COMMUNITY: STUDY VISIT TO THE VARAŽDIN COUNTY
